**She:**

Aegina  
Had **disappeared**

**Zues:**

A God  
**Kidnapped** her  
Aegina

Sisyphus:

- **Knew**

**Finally:**

Sisyphus  
**Told** Asopus  
About this

**He told:**

Asopus  
What **happened**

Zues:

A God  
**Kidnapped** her  
Aegina

This **act**:

- **By** Sisyphus
- **Infuriated** Zeus

Zeus got **angry**

This was:

**Crime**  
Against Gods  
By Sisyphus

- **Angered**
- Sent Thanatos
- **Death**
- **After** Sisyphus

*But Sisyphus:*

**Cunning**

Then he:

**Locked** them

Sisyphus:

- Used some
- **Trickery** to
- **Entrap** Death

In:

Heavy **chains**

Thanatos:

**Death**  
In **chains**

This **lasted**:

- Some **time**

Then:

War god **Ares**  
Set Thanatos  
**Free**

He **also**:

**Delivered**  
Sisyphus to  
Thanatos  
**Death**

## Continuing

Sisyphus:

- Managed to
- **Elude** Thanatos
- **Death**

*Sisyphus:*

*Still*  
*Went to*  
***Underworld***

*God there:*

*Was **Hades***

*God of*  
*The **underworld***

But:

- Sisyphus

*Went to **see***  
*Persephone*  
*Hades **wife***

*Sisyphus:*

***Pleaded***  
*With*  
*Persephone*  
***Queen***

He asked:

- Persephone
- For **permission**

*Permission:*

*To **return** to*  
*Earth*

*And **this**:*

*To **return** to  
Earth*

*For **three** days*

*He was **granted***

## **After Persephone**

Persephone:

- A Queen
- **Allowed**
- Sisyphus

***Three** days:*

*A **Mission**  
**Return** to Earth*

## **Second Part**

So Sisyphus:

- Did **return**
- To earth

***Three** days:*

*A **Mission**  
**Return** to Earth*

*But:*

*Sisyphus  
Had  
No **intention**  
Of going **back***

He did not:

- **Want**

Returning to  
The **underworld**  
World of **darkness**

So Sisyphus:

Was  
Rather **free**

**Escaped Death:**

**Second time**

**Cheating death:**

**Two times**

Zeus:

- Was **First**

**After:**

*Persephone*

*And ragged* **breath**

*He* **pushed** the

*Immense* **weight**

*Upward*

*Only to:*

*Have it*

**Slip** from his

**Grasp**

*Just as he*

**Reached** the

**Summit**

The **king:**

- Of Corinth
- Was **condemned**

*To an*

**Endless** task

*The **boulder:***

*Would then  
**Thunder** back  
**Down** the slope*

***Forcing** him:*

*Sisyphus  
To **begin** his  
Futile **labor**  
Anew*
